

### **Clearview DLT Meeting #3 Review**

This past week on Wednesday, **March 12th**, the Clearview District Leadership Team conducted their third quarter meeting of the 2024-25 school year. The DLT oversees the work of each Building Leadership Team, BLT, who in turn oversees the work of each Teacher Based Team, TBT. The DLT meets to review the Ohio Improvement Process, the OIP. It proved to once again be a **very collaborative**, **productive meeting**. The team conducted the following activities:

- 1. <u>TBT Update</u>: A review and update on the progress of each Teacher Based Team in the district was conducted. BLTs answered questions about each TBT in their school regarding the meeting process, communication, instructional focus areas, strengths, and student progress.
- 2. <u>Data Review</u>: Data from STAR, IXL, ProCore, and STAR CBM was shared with the DLT. Each BLT then analyzed their specific grade level data and progress from initial benchmark to our midyear testing. Then a review took place of how each data source is being utilized in each school building and how improvements can be made.
- **3.** <u>**RIMP Impact:**</u> New legislation was reviewed regarding the implementation of Reading Improvement Plans and state requirements. RIMPS will now follow a student into higher grades. Each BLT discussed the impact of the requirements and how to best address student RIMPS moving forward.
- 4. <u>Branching Minds Update</u>: An update was given as to the progress of data integration with our MTSS software Branching Minds. BLTs reviewed the site and reviewed plans of how to best utilize the program in Clearview for student intervention and support.

Kudos to the staff at VES this past week for helping to raise awareness for disabilities. Disability Awareness week 2024 was recognized nationally March 10th-14th. The committee was led by Intervention Specialist **Rosanna Darby**; great work Rosanna and all at VES! One of the awesome activities conducted is a school wide reading of the real life story of a deaf and blind puppy named Piglet who overcomes life's difficulties with a positive mindset. This year the staff were also introduced to Georgie, Piglet's brother,



who is also deaf and blind. He is known for his kindness. Therefore, kids learn about a Georgie Kindset and a Piglet Mindset!! Rosanna also arranges for the puppies' owner to make a virtual visit to VES. Great lessons are learned throughout the week. Nice work Rosanna and all at VES!!

### Instructional Strategies Review: Rethinking Classroom Discussion

In each issue of the Connection I will review a particular instructional strategy: Rethinking Classroom Discussion. Try different strategies to enhance classroom discussions by moving beyond the traditional raised-hand approach, which often favors outspoken students while leaving quieter ones disengaged. Expand participation to include peer discussions, polls, and surveys to ensure all students benefit from class dialogue. Other effective strategies include using nonverbal cues like hand signals to involve hesitant students, and incorporating think-pairshare activities for deeper engagement. Writing exercises can help students process their thoughts before speaking, and technology tools

like Google Docs and Nearpod offer low-risk ways for introverted students to contribute. These approaches create a more inclusive and dynamic classroom discussion environment where more kids can be involved in the whole class discussion beyond a hand raised. Learn more here ...

### Active, Engaged, and Innovative Classroom Learning in Clearview!

Each issue of the Curriculum Connection will include reports from our classrooms around the district. We want to do our best to promote active, engaged, and innovative lesson plans. What are your colleagues doing to engage Clearview students? The idea is to show appreciation for the hard work it takes to plan and develop such lessons.

I made a fun visit to Elizabeth Krajcik's first grade classroom this past week. These young Clippers were engage in a lesson about telling time and reading a traditional clock. Minute hand, hour hand, quarter after, half past, etc. - there are a lot of details regarding number sense and math for these kids to comprehend! Elizabeth used her interactive TV with a slide display

along with a model clock for her lesson. Using direct instruction kids followed along and answered guiding questions along the way. Elizabeth also did a

strategy where she took a class vote and tallied responses for the correct answer related to the lesson. Time for these kids and their teacher to receive some praise - well done!!

I made recent visit to **Dustie Cooper's** grade 8 ELA classroom. Her students were engaged in a reading unit on the novel Prisoner B-3087 by Alen Grantz. The novel is a powerful resource for Grade 8 ELA because it provides a compelling, age-appropriate introduction to the Holocaust through the true story of character Yanek Gruener's survival. The novel helps students develop empathy, critical thinking, and an understanding of historical events while analyzing literary elements. During my visit, Dustie conducted a whole class

reading accompanied with audio. She stopped to ask clarifying questions utilizing class discussion (see page 2!) She even used the turn and talk strategy. Dustie also conducts vocabulary and writing lessons associated with the novel unit. Great work!!

Check this out!! Grade 2 teachers at Vincent Elementary, Wendy Lachman and Andrew Holland, participated in the Hearts Across America challenge this year, with Wendy having taken part last year as well. This initiative provided an opportunity to introduce geography lessons, teach specific letter-writing formats, and engaged students in handwriting letters to send back to those who reached out. In Andrew's class, they connected with 24 states and eight other countries across four continents!! The students were excited, and they even received video correspondence from Nicholas Ferroni, a

nationally recognized teacher from New Jersey. Awesome lesson Andrew & Wendy!! Impressive.

Miles Jones teaches Social Studies at CHS. He teaches American Government and Puerto Rican History. However, another course he teaches is Hip Hop History, a very popular elective. I made a visit to this class this past week for a very interesting lesson - Miles was teaching students about hip hop beats. Not only are the students learning about the history and cultural impact of this style of music but they are also learning how to create the music! Miles has the students utilize an app

called BandLab. BandLab is a digital audio workstation app that allows his students to create, edit, and share music collaboratively. The app offers multi-track recording, virtual instruments, loops, and social features for musicians. On the day of my visit students were on the app, in headphones,

and attempting to create the beat of a song they are creating. Miles had a couple students share what they were creating. Next they will add instrumentation and other effects. Great!
