Clearview DLT Meeting Next Week

Ohio State Testing: OST Proctoring Requirement

Each issue of the Curriculum Connection from now until Spring will contain a section on Ohio State Testing Preparation. I will include details about test scheduling, test preparation, and test background. In this issue I am sharing info regarding state test proctor requirements. Teachers at each school in Clearview will serve as Ohio State Testing proctors in some capacity; all must ensure strict test security is specifically followed. Rules and regulations exist regarding this task. Not following proper procedures for state test proctoring can lead to a state investigation that is required, certainly something our

district wants to avoid. Cambium Assessments provides a course that reviews proper procedures and a test that certifies completion. **Principals will assist and lead teachers to ensure all are certified**

accordingly; they'll identify the specifics regarding the completion of this requirement. If needed, the link below can be used to gain access.

Certificates are collected by the principal at each school. Also, each building will have a required staff meeting to review state test proctoring procedures and other testing logistics. If you have any questions regarding certification please let me know and I will be happy to assist.

Instructional Strategies Review: Enliven Class Discussions with Gallery Walks

In each issue of the Connection I will review a particular instructional strategy: Gallery Walks. a **Gallery Walk** is an interactive teaching strategy where students move around the classroom to engage with different pieces of information, questions, or prompts displayed at various stations. If we want our classrooms to be truly student centered, then our students need to be sharing and teaching each other in much grander ways than just pair and share. Gallery walks get students up and out of their chairs and actively engaging with the content and each other. In gallery walks, students might display their computer or laptop screen, a group-made poster, a paragraph they've written, or a collage they've designed. Classmates check each other's work, perhaps providing feedback or praising each other, or both. During this activity, the teacher's role is one of a facilitator and/or a

Active, Engaged, and Innovative Classroom Learning in Clearview!

What are your colleagues doing to engage Clearview students? The idea is to show appreciation for the hard work it takes to plan and develop such lessons.

I made an interesting and entertaining visit to **Holly Miller's** Creative Writing classroom this past week at CHS. Holly gets very "creative" in providing her students with creative writing learning activities! This was indeed an example. She created a card game where kids draw a card that had a subject/person/theme and then motive cards that contained a stipulation (must

use the word "discombobulated" three times, etc.) Then the student must give an impromptu speech or rant for exactly one minute under the stipulations of the cards. Other motives included a break up speech, moody teenager, being apologetic, etc. Very Challenging! But her students did very well and were able to be creative while also using the tools of public speaking effectively as well. Great lesson!

In **Kari Cooley's** grade 8 math class this past week, **Rhonda Newman** assisting, kids were engaged in a fun cooperative game for the Pythagorean Theorem. It states that in a right-angled triangle, the

square of the hypotenuse is equal to the



sum of the squares of the other two sides: $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$; it's a fundamental concept in geometry that helps kids understand relationships

between distances and shapes. Kari provided an escape room type of challenge

where kids worked together to solve theorem problems she provided to expose a code. Upon checking for correct answers kids had to also draw a picture to explain the calculation to their group. Such a challenge not only required accurate calculation but also the reasoning behind such calculation. Awesome challenge!!

Recently in **Wendie Hutsenpiller's** Spanish 3 class at CHS students created board games based on topics from Spanish 1 and 2. The kids either adapted an existing game or designed their own, wrote the rules, and created at least 50 questions in Spanish. Before sharing, they tested their games to ensure they were playable regarding rules and directives.

Once completed, these creative students played and evaluated three other games. This activity provided a fun break from the norm as it combined Spanish language learning with fun board game application. Impresionante, muy creative!

Annually **Molly Streator**, grade 5 science teacher at DMS, conducts a Gallery Walk (see page 2!) with her unit on the solar system. Not only does Molly cover all of the standards associated with the unit but she also challenges students to create and produce a product of their own that serves as a form of



authentic assessment to "show what they know!" The kids never seem to disappoint as they produce amazing projects. Molly then conducts a Gallery Walk in the DMS cafeteria so that peers can review each other's projects and learn from one another. Great Work Molly!!
